

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING OF FIGSI ON 3RD AUGUST 2018 FROM 9.30 AM ONWARDS AT HOTEL LE-MERIDIEN, BENGALURU

Chairperson of SGM : Sri. R. Sekar, President, FIGSI

The members present list is attached

The meeting started with the National Anthem.

The Chairperson requested Sri. K.B. Munivenkata Swamy, CEO to ascertain the quorum of the house.

Sri. K.B. Munivenkata Swamy, CEO ascertained the quorum of the house which was in order.

Thereafter, Sri. N.K. Aswathrama, General Secretary requested the President to give the Welcome address.

1. Welcome by Chairperson.

Sri. R. Sekar, President welcomed the members to the Special General body meeting of the Federation of Indian Granite and Stone Industry to elect the new EC members for the term 2018-20.

He also welcomed the Founder President Sri. R. Veeramani and Past President Sri. Munavar Basha who have come to participate in the SGM and invited to Dais.

The President welcomed Sri. Aswathaiah, Assistant Registrar (Retd), Cooperative Dept (GOK), who has been appointed as the election officer and who also conducted the elections in the year 2016 in a systematic and democratic way and introduced him the members present.

He requested all the members to follow strict discipline and cooperate with the Election officer and his team for the smooth conduct of the election process. He requested the election officer to brief the members about the Election process to be followed.

2. Address by Election officer.

First of all I thank the FIGSI management for appointing me as the Election officer for the second time to conduct the Election to the Executive Committee of the federation for the term 2018-20.

The Executive Committee of the FIGSI has announced the calendar of events on 6th June 2018 and I am strictly adhering to the calendar of events. The election is being held as per the various provisions of the Byelaw of the federation and the duties and responsibilities prescribed in the bye-law of FIGSI clause no. 11.12 (b) .

The notification for calling for nomination, request for postal ballot /proxy with the calendar of events was dispatched by speed post on 6th June 2018 to all the members who are on the rolls of the federation as on that particular day. However as per the provisions of the bye law the members who have completed six months from the date of the approval of membership to the date of election are eligible for voting and the members who have completed two years from the date of approval of their membership to the last date of filing of nomination are eligible to be the candidate for the election and on this criteria total eligible members were 1141. The provisional voters list was announced on the same day.

The zone wise vacancies were announced as follows.

East Zone	1
West Zone	26
North Zone	4
South Zone	39
Total	70 seats

Against this totally we received 155 nominations (apart from this three were received after the last date). Out of the above 14 nominations were rejected and balance 141 nominations were found to be in order. The list of eligible candidates was announced on the website on 26th June 2018 along with the list of rejected nomination along with reasons for rejection. Out of this 14 candidates withdrew their nomination and finally 127 candidates were final candidates. The final list is as follows.

As per the bye-laws published the final eligible list of votes of 1145 and the same has been published and uploaded in the website.

The list was uploaded on the website and also SGM notice was sent to all the members of FIGSI on 4th July along with the list of contenting candidates.

The last date for receiving the request for postal ballot/proxy was 3rd July 2018 and we received 888 requests. On detail verification of the individual records of the members maintained by FIGSI, finally a number of 796 requests for postal ballot and 12 number for proxy request was found to be in order and balance were not considered for various reasons along with reasons for rejection which is announced in the website of FIGSI.

796 postal ballots and 12 proxy forms were sent by Speed post before 10th July 2018 as per the calendar of events. Few candidates were present and observed the process of sending postal ballot papers to that effect proceeding has been drawn. I have personally supervised the packing of all the ballot papers as per the approved list to ensure transparency in the dispatch. But however few covers were sent by the postal department on 11th even though we have handed it over on 10th itself, which is beyond the control of election team.

The last date of receiving the duly filled in postal ballot to the FIGSI office was 1st August 2018 and we have received 781 envelopes which are kept in 3 sealed ballot boxes in presence of few candidates who have signed on the sealed boxes and which will be opened in front of the candidates present at the time of counting.

Election officer informed that 1200 ballot papers were printed, out of which 796 was issued as postal ballot. Three ballot papers were spoiled and 5 papers were kept for official records as office copy. Balance ballot papers are available with me for issue to the members who cast their votes personally.

Friends, now the physical voting will take place from 10.30 am to 1.30 pm and such of the members who have not opted for postal ballot or proxy, they can cast their votes. The list of eligible members are published in the website with the name of the authorized persons of the member company. Kindly produce the Photo ID card issued by the FIGSI or any other photo ID issued by any government agency to obtain the identification slip to obtain the ballot paper. Four ballot papers will be issued one for each zone. As follows

Pink West Zone
White South Zone
Yellow East Zone
Green North Zone

Kindly go through the ballot paper carefully and cast your vote accordingly.

I have taken care to see that the entire process from the day one till date is done directly under by personal supervision in a systematic and democratic way and I have

also taken care to update the required information on the website of FIGSI from time to time.

Even I have also replied to the questions raised by some of the members during this period.

Once the voting process is completed by 1.30 pm, thereafter the counting will take place after 2.00 PM till end of the counting. Only the candidates are allowed to be present during the counting.

I request all the members to be polite with the election staff, follow discipline and kindly co-operate to conduct the election in free and fair manner.

Now I am showing the 4 empty ballot boxes and sealing the same in front of the candidate present. Each zone will have one separate box.

Thereafter, Sri. R. Sekar, President stated that the management had appointed a 3 member committee in FIGSI comprising of Dr. K. Subbaa Reddy, Dr. CH Rao and Sri. Ashok Bhogapura for identification of the voters and to assist the election officer. The committee was constituted in the Executive Committee Meeting of FIGSI held on 28th July 2018 at FIGSI premises.

At this point some of the members present raised objection on proceeding with the election process alleging violation of by-law / Calendar of Events and their request were not considered by the election officer etc.

Sri. Ratan Kumar Kandoi of M/s. Rashi Granite Exports India Pvt Ltd, mentioned we are having Mr. Veeramani, Gem group who is not only the Founder President of FIGSI but also the veteran in the Stone Industry who has contributed to growth of the Natural stone Industry of India. But it is unfortunate that lot of irregularities has taken place in this election and therefore he has to intervene and get rectified. He alleged that there was violation of bye-law. There is no provision for publishing the provisional voters list but the election officer has announced the provisional voters list. There after Final voters list was published which was having more number of voters. There is no provision to include the voters after the issue of calendar of events. Mr.Kandoi also mentioned that the present team is well experienced with the postal ballot system and we are new to this because of which they were able to manipulate a lot in the postal ballot.

Sri. Lalit Rathi, M/s. Lavina Granites, Bangalore informed that he along with few other candidates had sent a letter to the Federation requesting to set right some anomalies before the announcement of the calendar of events, but we were informed that calendar of events has been issued and election officer who is in charge of election will take care of everything. From day one there are so many violations.

As per the provisions of the byelaw for Limited/Private Limited Company, to ascertain the director position, DIN number is sought along with the resolution, but where as in case of the partnership company nothing is asked. We have noticed that one of the contenders is not at all a partner of the firm and his nomination has been accepted. This is gross violation of bye-law. Hence, election process has to recommence by publishing the calendar of events.

Sri. Sandeep Jalan, M/s. Sati Stone Studio Pvt. Ltd., said that election officer has mentioned that he has issued 796 postal ballot papers to the members who have requested for the same. Some of the envelopes were sent on 11th and few on 17th July, which is against the calendar of events. No respect has been given to the calendar of events. Some of the envelopes sent were empty and ballot papers were removed, When we requested for the copy of the postal receipt which is the only mode of confirmation, Election officer refused. He asks to collect it from the CEO and CEO says that he has sought legal opinion. To provide the details of the dispatch of ballot paper legal opinion, what a pity. Even till today the same has not been provided. This indicates that there is some mischief in the dispatch of the ballot paper. We are having a documentary evidence on this by the telephonic conversation between Sri. Anees-ur-Rehman with the sitting Vice president which clearly shows that the sitting office bearers, election officer and the officials of the FIGSI has joined hands in this malpractice.. In view of this all the postal ballots has to be cancelled. Only you can conduct the physical voting or call for fresh election by appointing a new election officer of high repute. Election officer writes to our friends informing that in case you are not satisfied with my reply, you can go to the appropriate authority. Which authority we have to go. Even now if the copies of the postal acknowledgment is made available, we can think of allowing the physical voting continued.

Mr. Dilip Kothari, M/s. Pearl Granexpo Pvt. Ltd. and Sridhar of M/s. Tropoical Granites and few more members also aggressively supported the issues raised by Mr. Sandeep Jalan.

However, the physical voting could not be taken up as some section of the members in the SGM started a hue and cry by stating that there was total non cooperation by the Election officer and alleged irregularities in the elections process. They expressed their opinion that the ballot papers were stolen and the entire bye-laws of FIGSI had been overlooked.

Sri. R. Veeramani mentioned that the amendment of bye-laws cannot be done across the table since procedure has to be followed. He urged the members to give a proposal to this effect. He stated that we cannot have a bye-law that can be 100 percent accepted to everyone he added.

Sri. R. Veeramani, Founder President said that we need to list out the number of members in the fields of Marble/ Sand stone and Quarrying sectors in the near future. He suggested to form a committee for 5 or 6 members who can take the suggestions

from the members and also help the election officer to proceed with the voting process.

The physical voting could not be held till afternoon due to the din and commotion and charges leveled by a section of the members and also the members were demanding that since FIGSI had not provided the docket numbers and tracking numbers of the list of ballots sent by FIGSI through the post office from Bangalore even though they had demanded it several times from the secretariat. The main bone of contention was the docket numbers demanded by the members and the refusal of the Secretariat to provide them. The members were very aggressive in their demand.

However on the contrary, the reason why it could not be provided by FIGSI was that since the Election officer Sri. Aswathaiah was in charge of conducting the elections and the orders issued by the Election officer could not be overruled by the FIGSI secretariat. Moreover the legal opinion was also against providing the said copies, since the election process was in progress.

Sri. Hemanshu Sehgal stated that as a lawyer he could say that one could not ask for the docket number under any circumstances and it could not be given. The information of one member cannot be disclosed to other member. In case any individual member who is not in receipt of the ballot paper, tracking number may be provided to them directly on request.

Sri. R. Veeramani, Founder President stated that a 6 member committee could be formed to sort out the matter. However again there was a din from the section of the members that a 7 member committee be constituted. Finally 7 members were agreed.

Sri. Mahaveer Singh Rathore suggested that the committee members should not be a candidate and every State unit should have representation.

However none of the suggestions were taken seriously by the section of the members and nothing was attained but a waste of time. There was no seriousness in anything that was said and done. Group of members were having one point of agenda of stopping the elections.

Sensing that the situation was totally untenable and a mockery of the section of the members and disrespected the Founder President and the Past President Sri. R. Veeramani walked out of the SGM as the section of the members like Mr. Kandoi, Mr, Rathi, Mr. Dilip Kothari, Dr. K. Subba Reddy, Mr. Sridharan, Mr. Mahesh, Mr. Mandanna and others were not in a mood to listen to the pleas of conducting the elections in a democratic and systematic manner. It became very clear that these members had come with a pre-set agenda to derail the election process for reasons best known to them.

Sri. Sunil K Arora suggested to continue the present committee for one more year and postponement of the election process. This suggestion was not accepted, by section of members who were in no mood to relent.

Sri. G. Krishna Rao was also of the opinion that the present election process has to be cancelled and re-conducted again within a said period. If the election officer is able to provide the details of the postal ballot there is no issue. But on the contrary if the Election officer is not able to provide the details of the postal ballot the elections may be conducted again within 3 months period. They wanted the decision to be taken by the Election officer.

Sri. R. Sekar, President again reiterated that the election process should go on. In a democratic system where everything was done in a transparent way we could not postpone the elections.

Sri. Munaveer Basha, Past President said that whatever was legally feasible should be adopted.

Sri. R. Sekar, Chairperson of the SGM tried his best to sort out the issue amicably by appealing to the section of the members to conduct the elections and the SGM had authorized the election officer to go ahead with the elections. This created chaos and the section of the members surrounded the President and other office bearers on the dais and created a ruckus.

Mr. Kandoi, Mr. Rathi, Mr. Prem Kumar Singal, Mr. Dilip Kothari, Mr. Mandanna, Mr. Ramesh Chopra (unauthorized person) and other members went and stood in front of the ballot boxes and physically prevented the Election Officer from sealing and shifting the ballot boxes to commence voting.

Election officer mentioned that Don't manhandle me and allow me to seal the ballot box and continue with the physical voting since already the Chairman of the SGM has announced the conduct of the election,

President informed that many of the members have come from outside Bangalore they are insisting for voting to be continued. Since there is no consensus, Joy Panakkal suggested to put to voting so that the majority of opinion could be obtained. President mentioned that even though the attendance signed in the SGM is 109, in the hall there were more than 350 members many of whom are unauthorized persons. He requested all the people who are not the members/authorized persons, to go out of the hall to enable to have a voting so that the election can be continued. But none of the members left the hall and the voting was not held.

Sri. Hemanshu Sehgal wanted to know the status quo of the ballot paper received by FIGSI to which the President replied that he could not tell it right there and then and would consult the Election officer.

Sri. Vinay Babu said that with regard to the Postal Ballot there is a need to cancel all the Postal ballots and call for fresh elections since the bone of contention was the postal ballot.

Sri. R. Shiva Kumar requested the members to be seated which went unheeded.

Sri. Aswathiah, Election Officer requested the President that since it was not possible to conduct the elections in a democratic manner and required his support to conduct the elections.

Sri. N.K. Aswathrama, General Secretary echoed the same sentiments of the Officer Bearers and urged the non members to move out of the Hall.

Sri. R. Sekar, Chairperson of the SGM stated that a small committee be formed and decide on the verification of the voters. The committee consisted of Dr. K. Subba Reddy, Sri. Adi Bhaskar, Sri S. Krishna Prasad and Sri. Mahaveer Singh Rathore.

After the committee names were announced Sri. Dilip Kothari objected to nominating Sri. S. Krishan Prasad on the committee.

Sri. Aswathiah, Election Officer again requested the members to allow him to conduct the elections and sealing of the ballot boxes which was not allowed by the section of the members. Few members stood in front of the ballot boxes and physically stopped the Election team in sealing the ballot boxes.

Sri. N.K. Aswathrama, General Secretary requested all the Vice President's of FIGSI to come on the dais.

Dr. K. Subbaa Reddy stated that the Executive Committee has given the power to conduct the election process and to take a decision. If they were not in a position to take a decision then the members had all the powers to take the decision. The members had come from far and wide and they could not be taken for a ride.

Dr. K. Subba Reddy said that it was a very serious situation wherein the same situation had happened in one of the associations and ultimately the association was taken over by the Registrar of Societies. That should not happen in the case of FIGSI which is having international repute.

Sri. R. Sekar, President invited the members for lunch since it was forenoon and nothing was moving as per the scheduled agenda. He stated that a decision on the matter would be taken after lunch.

Sri. R. Sekar, President after the luncheon session declared that the elections would be held as scheduled. However the section of the members were of the opinion that the President and other office bearers had no role to play once the elections were declared and it was only the Election officer who could declare whether the elections could be held or not.

The section of the members created an unruly scene and went back on their words and stated that they won't allow the elections to take place. There was a mob like fury which could make any sane thinking person nervous with the state of affairs unfolding. This was totally undemocratic and unethical on the part of the section of the members who were literally derailing the democratic process of conducting the elections. It was for the first time in the annals of history of FIGSI that such un-parliamentary language and manhandling of the election officer was witnessed and there could be no words to describe the volatile situation. There was scant respect for law and order and the honour for the Chair or senior members present.

Thereafter there were charges and counter charges from the members present in the SGM and a situation emerged when nobody knew what exactly was happening. It was a free for all environment where anybody could do anything they wanted in scant disregard to the institution where they were the Hon'ble members.

The Police bandobost which was there had also no clue to the happenings and in between they had also come inside the hall to see that there were no untoward incidents when the tempers ran high among the section of the members.

Sri. Aswathiah, Election Officer stated that the SGM had called for conducting the election process. He had to continue the process of conducting the elections or stop it and that he should have a reasonable answer either to conduct it or stop it. Presently there was a demand from one side to conduct the elections and not to conduct the elections from the other side. He mentioned that he and his team were physically stopped in sealing the ballot boxes to commence the election. In view of this he mentioned that he has given a letter to the President.

Sri. R. Sekar, President said that he had received a letter from the election officer stating that regarding the conduct of the elections there was a lot of disturbance from a group of members and the need to go for physical voting. There was also a verbal attack and physical stoppage from his performance to conduct the election or allowed to start. In view of the above he urged for physical security to be provided to him to avoid any untoward incidence or to postpone the physical voting by reasonable time.

Sri. R. Sekar, President read out the letter received from the election officer addressed to him which reads as follows:

Dear Sir,

Sub: Lot of disturbance from group of members to go head for physical voting for the election to the Executive Committee for the term 2018-20 in the SGM.

With reference to the above, this is to inform you that, in the SGM held today group of the members have made verbal attack and disturbed the entire election process and not allow me and my staff to seal the ballot boxes and start the election process.

The security arrangement is not sufficient to take care of my physical protection, staff and as well as election process.

In view of the above, I request you to kindly provide sufficient protection or take step for postpone the election for physical voting by reasonable time and also provide the information raised by the few members.

I request you the SGM may take appropriate decision in this regard and intimate me for further process.

By the turn of events taking place which was unprecedented and unwarranted and the day was coming to a close and the Election Officer also requested to provide sufficient protection or take step to postpone the election for physical voting by reasonable time. The President stated that after having discussion with the few members, as it is an all India body, he proposed that the physical Voting be postponed by 60 days. Any member having any queries could contact the Election officer or the CEO of FIGSI.

Dr. K. Subba Reddy suggested not to keep 60 days as the limit and we can go upto 90 days. In the meantime he suggested the continuation of the present team for 3 months as per the by-law provisions of FIGSI.

In the meantime the Federation has to run the administration and he proposed that according to the bye-law of FIGSI, the present administration be continued to run for 90 days or till the election is over. He requested the approval from the members to this effect.

Sri R.K. Kandoi suggested the President for postponing the elections. He called for a fresh calendar of events and if possible to have a separate office for the election process and conduct the elections in a free and fair manner.

Dr. Harpal Singh Yadav questioned that what was the guarantee that the same chaos would not follow in the next election?

Sri. N. Mahesh said that the entire idea behind is not to offend anyone. All the members present here were respectable business people and entrepreneurs and if anybody was offended in the process, he offered his apologies for the same. He complimented the President for taking the right decision to postpone the election process.

He urged the need for taking care of the Industry as there were many problems which the Industry was facing. FIGSI was the only representative All India body to take up the issues of the industry and solve the problems of the industry. He urged the need to take all the regional Presidents on board on the platform of FIGSI.

Sri. R. Shiva Kumar expressed his apologies on the behavior from the part of the section of the members and stated that they had no intention of hurting the sentiments of anybody personally and it was only the intention of the section of the members that they had not got the requisite and warranted answers from the office bearers for which they had a right as a member of FIGSI.

After lengthy discussions as above it was finally resolved to postpone the election by 60 days, which was welcomed by majority of the members.

Thereafter the meeting was adjourned.
